

1. a) **Outline the Jeremiah's prophesy (Jer. 23:5-6)**

- (i) The messiah would rule wisely (Jer. 23:5)
- (ii) He would be righteous
- (iii) He would reign as king
- (iv) He would bring salvation to Judah
- (v) The messiah would provide security/ safety in Israel (Jer. 23:6)
- (vi) The messiah would be a descendant of King David (Jer.23:5)
- (vii) He would be called "*the lord is our righteousness*" (Jer. 23:6)
- (viii) The messiah would execute justice and righteousness (Jer. 23:5)

b) **The visit of the Angel of the Lord to the shepherds on the night Jesus was born**

- (i) The shepherds were looking after their flocks in the field at night.
- (ii) The Angel appeared to them.
- (iii) The glory of the Lord shone around them.
- (iv) They were filled with fear.
- (v) The Angel reassured them.
- (vi) The angel told them about the good news about the birth of Jesus.
- (vii) They were told where to find baby Jesus.
- (viii) The angel gave them a sign on how to they would find Jesus.
- (ix) There appeared a host of other angels singing/ praising God.
- (x) The angels left them/ went back to heaven.
- (xi) The shepherds went to Bethlehem/ found Jesus.

c) **Reasons why Christians sing in a church service**

- (i) It is an opportunity to praise God
- (ii) Christians sing to pass a message/ pray through singing
- (iii) Singing removes tension/ makes worshippers relax
- (iv) Singing creates an atmosphere of worship
- (v) Singing removes boredom because of the varied activities during the service
- (vi) God given talents are portrayed/ enhanced during singing
- (vii) Non-members are attracted to the church through singing
- (viii) Those depressed are encouraged through singing
- (ix) Singing unites/brings worshippers together as they all join in a chorus/ song/harmony. 1 x 5=5mks

2. a) **Outline Jesus teachings on the qualities of true discipleship (Luke 6:27- 49)**

- (i) Perseverance: The apostles were expected to persevere in the face of persecution/suffering e.g. death, beating, expulsion, etc.
- (ii) Implementers of Jesus teachings. The apostles were to live the teachings of Jesus and act as examples to other Christians.
- (iii) Love for enemies: The apostles were to appreciate the strength of their enemies rather than their weakness.
- (iv) Virtue of generosity: The apostles were expected to practice the virtue of generosity i.e. share with others what they have.

- (v) Exercising self-criticism: Apostles were to exercise self-criticism before judging others.
- (vi) Show Compassion: The apostles were to show compassion to others/be merciful and loving.
- (vii) Show Obedience: The apostles were also expected to show total obedience to the teachings of Jesus Christ.

b) The story of the raising of the widow's son at Nain (Luke 7: 11- 17)

- (i) Jesus went to the city of Nain accompanied by his disciples/ crowd
- (ii) At the age of the city, he met people carrying a dead man
- (iii) The dead man was the only son of the widow
- (iv) The mother/ widow was accompanied by a large crowd
- (v) Jesus felt pity for the widow/ told her not to weep
- (vi) Jesus touched the bier (coffin) in which the body lay
- (vii) Jesus told the dead man to arise
- (viii) The dead man sat up/ began to speak
- (ix) Jesus gave the man to his mother
- (x) The people were filled with fear
- (xi) The people glorified the lord
- (xii) Jesus fame spread in Judea/ in the surrounding region

c) How the church continues with the healing ministry of Jesus Christ

- (i) Christians pray for/ preach to the sick
- (ii) Laying hands on the sick/ anointing them/ any other miraculous healing
- (iii) Providing guidance and counseling services
- (iv) Constructing hospitals/ health centers/ rehabilitation centers
- (v) Providing preventive/ curative drugs/ treating the sick
- (vi) Paying medical expenses for the sick
- (vii) Producing/ disseminating literature/ electronic media on health issues
- (viii) Preaching against evil/ causes of ailments that interfere with good health
- (ix) Providing food/ clothing/ shelter/ finances to the sick/ needy
- (x) Visiting the sick
- (xi) Training medical personnel
- (xii) Educating through seminars/ workshops (7 x 1 = 7 mks)

3. a) Seven instructions that Jesus gave to the seventy-two disciples when he sent them on a mission (Luke 10:1-24)

- (i) The disciples were to pray for more labourers to be sent for the harvest,
- (ii) The disciples were not to carry any pulse / bag / sandals.
- (iii) They were not to salute anyone on the road.
- (iv) They were to say peace any house they entered.
- (v) They were to remain in the same house / NOT to go from house to house.
- (vi) They were to eat / drink whatever was provided.
- (vii) They were to heal the sick
- (viii) They were, to tell the people that the kingdom of God has come near

(ix) They were to wipe off the dust on their feet against the people if not received.

b) **The parable of the Pharisee and the Tax collector (Luke 18:9-14)**

(i) Two men went into the Temple to pray, a Pharisee and a tax collector.

(ii) The Pharisee praised himself in prayer.

(iii) He said he was holy / better than others / tax collector.

(iv) The tax collector also prayed but could not lift his eyes to heaven.

(v) The tax collector beat his breast saying he is a sinner / asked for God's mercy.

(vi) It was the prayer of the tax collector that was accepted / the tax collector was justified

(vii) Jesus concluded by saying that whoever exalts himself will be humbled / whoever humbles himself will be exalted.

c) **Six reasons why a Christian should pray**

(i) To show their dependence in God / faith in God

(ii) To express the power / greatness of God / adore / honour God

(iii) They pray to ask for their needs / seek guidance.

(iv) Through prayer, they confess their sins / ask for forgiveness.

(v) To thank God for his faithfulness / goodness / blessings.

(vi) Prayer helps to relieve fears / anxiety / worries.

(vii) It is an instrument through which the work of Satan is destroyed.

(viii) To communicate with God / have fellowship with God.

(ix) To follow the example of Jesus.

(x) It is a command from God / a sign of obedience.

(i) Fruit of Love

(ii) Fruit of Joy

(iii) Fruit of Kindness

(iv) Fruit of Goodness

(v) Fruit of Self- control

(vi) Fruit of Gentleness

(vii) Fruit of Patience

(viii) Fruit of Faithfulness

(i) Explain how the unity of believers is expressed in the Image of the bride.

(Revelation 2: 1- 2) (8marks)

(ii) Christians are the **bride** to be married to Jesus Christ

(iii) Jesus is the **bridegroom**.

(iv) The church is to be committed to Christ, just as the bride is committed to the bridegroom

- (v) The church is loved by Christ as the bridegroom loves the bride.
- (vi) The bride must preserve her purity as a way of waiting for the groom.
Likewise, Christians are to remain pure and holy through love and faith in Jesus Christ.
- (vii) The bride groom/ Christ will come to take his church forever/ eternity just as the bride and groom have a permanent union.
- (viii) Just as the bride goes to live with the groom in their matrimonial home, so will the church leave for their home, heaven (New Jerusalem)
- (ix) The church (Bride) will live in peace or happiness forever after being taken by Christ as there will be no suffering or death.

c) State Six ways in which Christians can bear the fruit of the Spirit in their lives

- (i) Performing works of charity/helping less fortunate/ needy.
- (ii) Preaching the gospel to others.
- (iii) Forgiving those who wrong them/reconcile with others.
- (iv) Repenting of their sins/accept wrong done.
- (v) Obeying God's commandments and putting them into practice.
- (vi) Reading the bible/attending bible study/fellowship for spiritual nourishment.
- (vii) Doing good and avoiding evil/leading righteous life/Holy.
- (viii) Keeping off from immorality and maintaining chastity.

5. a) State the importance of leisure in the life of a Christian.

- i. It allows the individual time to regain lost energy.
- ii. It gives one time to visit the sick and pray with them /for them
- iii. It gives one an opportunity to dedicate one's life to God through worship.
- iv. It provides an opportunity for fellowship with others.
- v. It allows one an opportunity to develop Gods given talents.
- vi. It gives one an opportunity to visit friends / relatives.
- vii. It gives one an opportunity to read the bible and grow spiritually.
- viii. It gives one time to carry out work of preaching / evangelism
- ix. It gives one opportunity to guide and counsel others.
- x. It gives one time to take care of the environment by clearing / cultivating it.
- xi. Gives one time for meditation on God's word.

- i. Carry out their duties efficiently
- ii. Work for the welfare of the enterprise
- iii. Be loyal to the employer.
- iv. Observe the terms of contract
- v. Show good will to the employer.

- vii. Not to join strikes for unreasonable demands.
- viii. Be honest / carry out duties without supervision
- ix. Pray for the success of the enterprise. To protect and care for the employer's property.

- x. To work diligently for self-fulfillment and development.
- xi. To give enough notice to the employer when one plans to leave the job
- xii. To be faithful to the employer by being punctual.

- i. Lack of enough money/poverty.
- ii. Inadequate facilities.
- iii. Insufficient time / career demands
Ignorance of availability of leisure
- iv. Involvement in family responsibilities at the expense of leisure vi) Career / job demands.
- v. People involve themselves more in passive leisure e.g. T.V, Smart phones.

6.a) Outline the rights of a Kenyan citizen. (7 marks)

- ✓ Right to life/ live
- ✓ Right to have basic needs/ food/ shelter/ clothing
- ✓ Right to receive education
- ✓ Right to marry/ raise up a family/ belong to a family
- ✓ Right to have freedom of association/ assembly
- ✓ Right to freedom of speech/ receive information/ expression
- ✓ Right to own property
- ✓ Freedom of worship
- ✓ Right to liberty/ movement
- ✓ Right to work/ earn a living
- ✓ Right to medical care/ health
- ✓ Right to security/ protection by law
- ✓ Freedom of conscience / right to vote

b) Explain the importance of paying taxes as a Christian to the Government of Kenya.(5 marks)

- ✓ To emulate Jesus who paid tax to the Roman authorities
- ✓ To heed Jesus instructions to respect the civil authorities
- ✓ Christians pay taxes in order to receive service from the government
- ✓ To provide essential services
- ✓ Christians pay taxes as a sign of patriotism
- ✓ Christians pay taxes as a way of sharing their wealth/ resources with others
- ✓ It is their duty to pay taxes to the government
- ✓ To enable the government to meet its financial obligations

(x) Discuss four ways in which the church could help to eradicate crime in Kenya.(8 marks)

- ✓ Providing guidance and counseling

- ✓ Preaching about love for one another in the society
- ✓ Rehabilitating law breakers
- ✓ Providing jobs/ offering training opportunities to the people
- ✓ Giving loans to people to start/ run business
- ✓ Providing recreational facilities/ organizing recreational activities for the youth
- ✓ Reporting criminals to the law enforcement authorities
- ✓ Disciplining deviant members of the church
- ✓ Participating in government programmes established to fight crime (e.g. community policing)
- ✓ Obeying the laws of the country/ being role models
- ✓ Praying for peace/ harmony
- ✓ Teaching responsible parenthood
- ✓ Providing basic needs for the needy
- ✓ Condemning evil practices in the society/ teaching against crime.
