19. Explain two factors that determine time of planting. (2mks)

- h. Soil moisture-soil moisture is needed for the germination of planting materials. Plantingis done when the soil moisture for most of crops. This moisture is either from rain or irrigation.
- i. Onset of rains-rain makes the soil moist. Most crops are planted when the rain is expected or start or has started.
- j. Timed market-crops grown for certain markets are planted at such a time when their maturity and harvesting will coincide with the time the produce is needed in the market.
- k. Need for continuous supply of produce in the market-different portions of the field are planted at different time to ensure that the crop will mature at different time and therefore provide continuous supply of the produce in the market. This is what is referred to as staggered planting.
- 1. Time of harvesting-some crops are planted at a time when their harvesting will coincide with a dry spell or with a certain market demand.


- 22. Mention three guidelines for cooking food by roasting. (3mks)
