1. a) **State the message of Angel Gabriel to Zachariah during the annunciation of the birth of John the Baptist.** (8mks)
- Don't be afraid-God had heard your prayer
  - Your wife will bear a son.
  - Will be called John
  - Will make many people happy
  - Will be great in the sight of God
  - Will not drink wine
  - Will be filled with Holy Spirit
  - Will bring back many people of Israel to God
  - Will be strong like Elijah
  - Will bring back children to fathers
- b) **Give Five similarities between the annunciation of the birth of Jesus and John the Baptist** (5mks) 1 x 8
- Both were extra – ordinary
  - Their names – given before both / both were male children
  - Their mission / role known before birth
  - Both were filled with the holy spirit
  - Both parents were afraid when they receive the message
- c) **How do Christians prepare for the coming of the messiah.** (7mks)
- Keep vigilant watch and pray.
  - Live righteous live
  - Undertake baptism
  - Preaching the Gospel to win move to Christ

2. a) **State Seven teachings of John the Baptist about the messiah.** (7mks)
- The messiah will be greater than him / famous
  - Messiah will Baptist people with the Holy spirit and five
  - He will proclaim judgment on sinners
  - He will reward the righteous with eternal life.
  - He will be the lamb of God
  - He will forgive people sins
  - He will be the savior of the world
  - He will be anointed by God
- b) **Describe the call of the first disciple in Luke 5 : 1 – 11** (7mks)
- Jesus saw the fishermen washing their nets by lake Geneserat
  - He got into one of their boat / peter's
  - He sat down and taught the crowd from the boat
  - Peter told him they had been fishing the whole nit and he got no fish
  - He later accepted to lower the nets as commander by Jesus
  - They caught a large catch and their nets were breaking
  - They called other friends to come and help them.

- viii) When peter saw this he fell on Jesus feet and confessed that he was a sinner
- ix) The other fishermen were astonished
- x) Jesus told them not to be afraid because He was going to make them fishers of men

5. (a) **On what grounds was Jesus rejected in Nazareth?**

- Jesus was accused of blasphemy because he claimed to be the son of God & forgave sins
- Jesus was accused of breaking the Sabbath law by healing on the Sabbath
- Jesus was unwilling to perform the miracles that he had performed in Capernaum. This was because miracles had a purpose, they were not to be performed on peoples whims
- Jesus gave the example of Elijah and Elisha performing miracles among the Gentiles. The Jews felt that Jesus was comparing them unfavorably to the Gentiles
- In his preaching; Jesus accused the Jewish forefathers of rejecting & killing God's prophets
- Jesus did not come as a messiah in the way the Jews expected. He was an ordinary person from a humble background **(1 x 6 = 6marks)**

(b) **Reasons why Jesus was baptized**

- Baptism prepared Jesus for his mission
- Baptism was God's assurance that he was pleased with Jesus and thus marked the beginning of his mission
- Baptism was a means to empower Jesus through the holy spirit
- Baptism assured John & others that Jesus was the son of God
- Baptism through the holy spirit confirmed the divine origin of Jesus
- The baptism of Jesus was an approval of John the Baptist's work as the forerunner of the messiah
- Baptism introduced Jesus to the people **(1 x 7 = 7marks)**

(c) **Lessons that Christian's learn from the healing of the blind beggar (Lk. 18:35-43)**

- Jesus came to save people from all their sickness
- Jesus is identified as the son of God
- Faith is important for one to be healed
- Jesus has power to heal
- Christian's should seek God's reconciliation
- Christians should not stand in the way of those seeking the Kingdom of God
- Jesus had/has mercy on the people who are suffering
- Christian's should admit their shortcomings & repent in order to receive spiritual gift **(1 x 7 = 7 marks)**

6. (a) **Outline Peter's denial of Jesus**

- Jesus was arrested & taken away into the house of the high priest & Peter followed at a distance

- A woman saw Peter sitting at a fire in the county yard and said that he had been with Jesus but Peter denied it
- After a while a man noticed peter and said he was one of them but again Peter denied it
- About an hour later another man insisted that peter had been with Jesus but for the third time he denied it
- At once a cock crowed & peter remembered that Jesus had said he would deny him three times
- Peter went away & wept bitterly  
**(4 x 2 = 8mks)**

**(b) Narrate the parable of the lamp under a bowl (Luke 8:16-18)**

- Jesus said that people do not light a lamp only to cover it with a bowl or hide it under a bed. They light it and put it on a lamp stand so that everybody will see the light as they come in
- The parable points to how people respond to God's word
- Those who hear and accept the word are a light to others
- The mysteries of the kingdom of God revealed to the disciples should be brought to light for others to understand too
- People should not be embarrassed about being Christians
- The parable depicts the millions of followers of Christ to spread the word of God to other people

**(c) The significances of passion, death & resurrection of Jesus to Christian's today**

- Throughout his suffering, Jesus was strengthened through prayers. Christians are encouraged to turn to prayers when in difficulties
- Jesus brought salvation to the whole mankind through his death on the cross
- Just as Christ showed love to his tormentors Christian's are urged to show love to everybody
- Christians learn that God is always to forgive their sins, just as he forgave those of the repentant thief
- Christians are taught by Jesus to strengthen one another when they fall into temptations
- Jesus' trial by Pilate teaches Christians not to be swayed from the path of justice by fear
- Christian's are cautioned to avoid passing false judgment in order to satisfy selfish ends
