- a. Creates a sense of identity-bring people together, creating shared experiences that help to foster a sense of community and collective identity.

Through creative arts and sports culture is preserved-it ensures that our history and traditions are not forgotten, and that future generations can appreciate and learn from them.

b. Principle of Proportion in Visual arts.

Proportion refers to the dimensions of a composition and relationships between height, width and depth. How proportion is used will affect how realistic or stylized.

Proportion also describes how the sizes of different parts of a piece of art or design relate to each other.


Proportion in any art is the relative size of objects in relation to each other or corresponding to the other elements as a whole.


A colour wheel is an arrangement of colours on a circular diagram to show how they and are related to each other.



The body is the mobile instrument of the dancer and helps inform us of what is moving.
 - b. Action This is what a dancer does, for example travelling, turning, elevation, gesture, stillness, use of body parts, floor-work and the transference of weight
 - c. Space Space refers to the area through which the dancer's body moves.

- **d.** Time It is an essential part of choreographing and performing dance. It helps us to stay together when we dance in unison, identify the beat and the rhythm of how we move and provide stimulus for choreography.
