**1. a) Describe the call of Moses (3:1-22)**

- God called him when he was herding his father in law's flock
- He saw a burning bush which was not getting consumed
- He went near the burning bush to see what was happening
- God instructed him to remove his sandals as the ground where he was standing was holy
- He feared and hid his face from the sight of God
- God reminded him of the suffering of his people in Egypt
- Moses then enquired about God's identity
- God revealed himself to him as "I am who I am"
- God gave Moses signs to empower him such as changing the rod in his hand into a snake
- Moses was reluctant to accept God's call as he was slow in speech
- God provided him with Aaron as his spokesman
- Moses eventually accepted God's call

## 2. a) State the similarities between the traditional African and Old Testament prophets

- Both mediated between God and the people
- Both were consulted by people during crisis
- Both received revelation from God
- Both received divine calling
- Both communicated God's message to the people
- Both warned people about impending disaster
- Both spoke with authority
- In both they were religious experts (7x1=7 marks)



## b) Explain how prophetic messages were written

- They were written on scrolls or stone tablets
- The messages were translated by inspired writers
- Some prophets wrote the messages themselves
- Some prophets dictated the messages to the scribes
- God instructed some prophets on what to write
- Some prophetic messages were preserved and passed on through oral traditions
- Sometimes the prophet's disciples collected the writings and put them down in piece form (6x1=6 marks)

## c) How does God reveal Himself to Christians today?

- Through visions

- They acted as mediators between God and the People
- They guided and counseled people

- They warned people of God's impending judgment
- Some acted as priests
- They interceded for the people through prayers
- They condemned evils in the society
- They gave an assurance of hope to the people
- They foretold future events
- They acted as conscience of Kings and the people
- The taught people the covenant way of life (7 x 1 =7 marks)

**c) Give seven ways in which Christians carry out their prophetic role in the society today.**

- They preach the gospel to people
- They live exemplary life
- They condemn evils in the society
- They advise political leaders
- They advocate for worship of one God
- They intercede for others
- They guide and counsel the people
- Assist the needy
- Give hope to hopeless
- Courageously defend the truth and what is right

**4. a) Explain how the unity of believers is expressed in the image of the bride.**

- Christians are the bride
- Jesus is the bridegroom
- Christian /church are to be committed to Christ as the bride is committed to the bridegroom
- The church is loved by Christ just as the bridegroom loves his bride
- The church must remain pure/holy through love/ faith in Jesus as the bride keeps her purity for her husband
- The committed Christians will be taken to a new home/ heaven just as the bride is taken home by her husband
- The union between Christ and the church will be everlasting just as the union between the bride and the bridegroom is permanent.

**b) State six ways in which the life of Peter was transformed on the day of Pentecost.**

- He was filled with the power of the Holy Spirit
- He spoke in tongues
- He defended the apostles that they were not drunk
- Peter become courageous
- He preached the word of God
- He became a witness of the work/death and resurrection of Jesus Christ
- He was able to remember/narrate old testament scriptures
- He gained wisdom/advised the people on what to do.

**c) Identify ways in which the gifts of the Holy Spirit are misused in the church today.**

- Some Christians pretend that they have a certain gift of the Holy spirit;
- By asking for payment before healing the sick;
- Christians misuse the gift of prophecy by giving wrong information;
- Some Christians may impart demonic powers on the innocent/ignorant as they claim to perform miracles;
- Some Christians who possess the gifts of the Holy spirit develop pride/arrogance;
- Some use the gifts to bring division in the church/creating splinter groups;
- Some Christians refuse to utilize the gifts they possess/personalize the gifts;
- Speaking in tongues during worship leads to disorder/confusion if the tongues are not interpreted/ understood.

**5. a) Describe the temptation of Jesus in the wilderness before he began his public ministry.**

- Jesus was led into the wilderness he stayed for forty days
- He ate nothing and therefore he felt hungry
- The devil asked him to command a stone to become bread if he was the son of God.
- Jesus told him that man could not live by bread alone
- The devil took Jesus up and showed him the kingdoms of the world and asked him to worship him, so that he could give him everything.
- Jesus told the devil that only God alone is to be worshipped
- The devil took Jesus to the pinnacle of the temple and asked him to throw himself down for God would command angels to guard him.
- Jesus told the devil that one should not tempt God

**b) What lessons do Christians learn from the temptation of Jesus?**

- They should be knowledgeable in scriptures/biblical verses
- They should resist the devil
- Temptations are part and parcel of Christian life
- They should have faith in God
- They should worship God alone

- They should desire to have the Holy Spirit
- They should not misuse the power of the Holy Spirit
- They should be contented with what they have
- Fasting is important in their lives

**c) Identify problems faced by new converts in the church today.**

- They are sometimes not fully accepted/integrated/discriminated against
- The older Christians may not serve as role models
- They may not be involved in activities/not given responsibilities
- They are tempted to backslide to previous lifestyle
- Older Christians expect them to change faster than they can
- Some experience problems of communication/language barrier
- They may lack Christian literature to strengthen their faith
- In large churches, they get lost in the crowd/not identified/not recognized
- The financial demands of the church may be too much for them
- Lack of assistance/concern when a new member is in need.
- Some get frustrated when their expectations are not met
- They are given /assigned duties which they can't manage
- They maybe rebuked/embarrassed in public when suspected to be in wrong

**6. a) Relate the healing of the blind beggar on the way to Jericho (Luke 18: 35-40)**

- Jesus came across blind beggar near Jericho
- The blind man heard a commotion of people passing by
- The beggar wanted to know what was happening
- People informed him that Jesus of Nazareth was passing by
- He shouted addressing Jesus as son of David and asked Jesus to have mercy on him
- The people asked the beggar to be silent but he shouted more
- Jesus stopped and asked him what he wanted
- The blind man said that he wanted to see again
- Jesus told him to receive the sight again because his faith made him well
- The beggar immediately received the sight

- He followed Jesus glorifying God
- When people saw this , they glorified God

**b) Outline the events that took place when Jesus died on the cross**

- Darkness covered the land between the sixth and the ninth hour
- The curtain of the temple was torn into two
- A centurion testified that truly Jesus was the son of God
- The crowd who watched death of Jesus returned home beating their breasts
- Jesus acquaintances and the women who followed Him from galilee stood at a distance watching the events unfold
- There were earth tremors/ earth quake
