- iii. Moses turned to see the bush.
- iv. God called his name out of the midst of the bush.
- v. Moses responded by saying "Here I am'
- vi. God commanded Moses not to move near / to remove his shows because the place was holy.
- vii. God revealed to Moses as God of his ancestors
- viii. God told Moses that he had seen the suffering of his people in Egypt and had come to deliver them.
- ix. Wanted to send Moses to Pharaoh to release his people.
- x. Moses was reluctant to be sent to Pharaoh
- xi. God promised to be with him.
- xii. Moses sought to know the name of God who was sending him and revealed His name as "I am who I am."
- xiii. God told Moses to go and gather elders of Israel and tell them God's message about their deliverance.
- xiv. Moses was told to go with elders to Pharaoh to ask their release from Egypt.

- ix. They filled both boats with fish and the boat began to sink
- x. Simon Peter and his companions were astonished to the miraculous catch of fish.
