Machine is not oiled

13. Why linen fabrics are popular for making table linen in Kenyan hotels. (2 mks)

Linen is easy to launder

Linen can withstand high temperatures during laundry

14. Identify silk using the burning test

(2 mks)

Silk curls or smolders (½) away from a flame, smells like burning feathers/hair (½) and leaves a black bead (½) which crashes (½) if squeezed.

15. Rules to observe when deep frying fish fillet.

Use a pan with a heavy base
Ensure the oil is hot enough before putting the fish
Do not put too much of the fish into the hot oil as it lowers the temperature
Ensure the fish is dry before putting in to avoid splattering
Lower the fish gently into the hot oil

The type of fabric

18. a) How to launder a fast coloured synthetic dress with a grease stain.

(10 mks)

Collect materials and equipment (1/2)

Cover the stain with an absorbent/grease solvent ($\frac{1}{2}$) for 10 - 15 minutes

Wash the stained area($\frac{1}{2}$) in warm ($\frac{1}{2}$) soapy ($\frac{1}{2}$) water to ensure the stain is removed

Wash (½) the garment in warm (½) soapy (½) water, using kneading and squeezing/gentle

friction (1)

Rinse ($\frac{1}{2}$) in warm ($\frac{1}{2}$) water

Finally rinse $(\frac{1}{2})$ in cold $(\frac{1}{2})$ water with a fabric conditioner $(\frac{1}{2})$

Drip dry (½) straight on the clothes line under the shade (½) using pegs/hanger (½)

Iron ($\frac{1}{2}$) using warm ($\frac{1}{2}$) iron

Air (1/2)

Fold and store (1/2)

Clean and store all materials and equipment used (1/2)

SECTION C

19. a) State five activities an expectant mother should be involved in at the antenatal clinic. (5 mks)



Checking of the blood pressure

Checking of the sugar and protein levels in the urine

Blood group is checked and noted incase she may need blood transfusion after delivery Levels of iron/haemoglobin in the blood is checked to ascertain if there is need for supplementation

If ill, the mother is treated and also advised on diet and exercises in order to stay healthy Tested for HIV for the mother to know her status

b) Definition of terms:

(6 mks)

i. Maternal child health care

Care given to an expectant mother and the unborn baby as well as care the mother and baby gets after delivery aimed at improving the quality of life

ii. Haemorrhoids

These are enlarged/swollen veins at the anal region which are painful, itchy or are just uncomfortable

iii. Passive immunity

Is the transfer of ready-made antibodies as active immunity in body fluids(humoral) from the mother to the foetus through the placenta and breast milk

or

Immunity that occurs naturally when maternal antibodies are transferred to the foetus through the placenta and later through breast milk

c) Ways expectant mothers benefit from free maternal care offered by the government. (6 mks)

Safe delivery – expectant mothers are able to deliver safely and in clean facilities Proper medical support – women who cannot afford medical care during pregnancy are able to access free medicine and support from maternal health clinic

Reduce infant death and child mortality rate – early identification and treatment of pregnancy related complications ensure babies are safe and healthy during pregnancy and after birth

Safe pregnancy – expectant women are advised on proper care during pregnancy and also

given supplements to boost their nutrients ensuring a problem free pregnancy Reduced maternal deaths – pregnancy complications are identified and dealt with early enough reducing the risk of maternal deaths.

If the babies develop throat infection

20. a) Symbol depicting

i. Do not bleach



ii. Drip dry

b) Points to consider when choosing toys for a 1½ year old.

(8 mks)

Should be varied to allow for different activities
Attractive in colour to stimulate the baby's senses
Toys should be light in weight, easy to carry around
Should not have small parts that the baby can swallow to avoid choking
They should be easy to keep clean/washable to avoid dirt/infections
They should have smooth edges to avoid hurting the baby
They should be easy to manipulate without guidance

c) Good grooming habits that help in the prevention of dandruff.

(4 mks)

Ensuring the hair is always clean



Avoid sharing of combs, brushes, hats, scarves, wigs, towels etc. Using an antiseptic in the final rinsing water while cleaning hair Disinfecting combs and brushes occasionally Eating a balanced diet

d) Points to consider when selecting a drying rack.

(4 mks)

Should be made of rust-free/rust less material to avoid staining clothes
The wooden racks should be painted to protect from effects of weather
The design should enable folding to save on storage space/for easy storage
Choose the correct size to depending on the amount of washing to hold
Should be smooth to avoid damaging fabrics
It should be more stable on the ground

21. a) Ways breast milk production can be improved.

(5 mks)

Mother should increase intake of fluids

Ensure the mother is relaxed when breastfeeding

Mother should breastfeed baby regularly to enhance hormones that ensure milk production

Mother should avoid smoking and alcohol as this reduces milk production

Ensure mother rests enough as stress reduces production of milk

Ensuring the mother feeds well on a balanced diet

b) Reasons a family needs to be prepared for the arrival of a new born baby.

(5 mks)

To avoid the last-minute rush

To avoid straining the family with bulk buying of baby's requirements

Enable family members to help the mother with small tasks in connection to the new baby

To enable members of the family to be more psychologically prepared hence more understanding and loving towards the new baby

To enable family members to accept the baby as a member of the family

To avoid unnecessary anxiety

c) Explain **three** advantages of stewing as a method of cooking.

(6 mks)



Does not require close attention except for occasional stirring hence saving on time The liquid (gravy) of the food is served together with the food thus conserving nutrients Economical method of providing a meat dish from cheap cuts of meat cooked slowly for a long time

Natural flavour of food is developed during the long slow cooking making the food more enjoyable

Water soluble nutrients are conserved as evaporation is minimized by use of a tight-fitting lid Does not require special cooking facilities and can be prepared on a three stone fire place

d) Suggest **four** ways to ensure fresh milk remains safe for consumption at home. (4 mks)

Store milk in clean containers
Keep in a cool place/refrigerator to avoid spoilage
Do not mix milk from different sources to avoid contamination
Keep milk containers covered to protect from dust and flies
Boil milk in clean saucepans to kill germs
