- vi. Jesus told Jairus house brought a message that his daughter will be well
- vii. Jesus went into the house with peter, john and James and the parents of the child.
- viii. The people were weeping and wailing for her and Jesus told them not to weep because she was not dead.
- ix. Jesus took the child by hand and told her to arise
- x. Her spirit returned and she got up at once
- xi. Jesus directed that she be given something to eat
- xii. The parents of the child were amazed
- xiii. Jesus charged them not to tell anyone what had happened

- vi. Political affiliations influence some Christians from helping those who don't belong to their party
- vii. Selfishness/individualism makes some Christians ignore those suffering
- viii. Poor infrastructure/communication in some areas make it difficult to reach the needy.
