1. FUNCTIONAL WRITING

➤ Must be in report format. If not deduct 2AD

Format – 7 marks

- ➤ Heading or title 1 mark (capitalized and underlined)
- \succ Terms of reference or introduction $\sqrt{1}$
- \triangleright Procedure $\sqrt{1}$
- \rightarrow Findings $\sqrt{1}$
- \triangleright Conclusion $\sqrt{1}$
- ➤ Recommendations √ 1
- \triangleright Signing off $\sqrt{1}$

Content 8 marks

- > Terms of reference/introduction
- Show the purpose of the report (1 mk)
- > Procedure (2 mks)
- Findings (2 mks)
- > Conclusion (1 mk)
- Recommendations (2 mks)
 - The candidate should give at least two recommendations
 - Should be in point form

Language accuracy 4 marks

- Ability to communicate accurately
- > Proficient use of language structures
- > Coherence
- > Appropriate punctuation
- Penalize for poor grammar (tenses, punctuations. S.V.A)
- Penalize for sentence construction, spelling mistakes etc
- > Tone must be formal

Fill each blank space in the following passage with the most appropriate word.

b) Explain whether or not turn-taking has taken place in the conversation

(4 marks)

- Joy: Come in. Oh, it is you Ben? I thought it was Grace.
- Ben: No, it isn't. How are.....
- Joy: Grace can sometimes be ouch as a nag. Don't you think so?
- Ben: (Thinking reflectively) Mm......
- Joy: Forget it! I can see you don't agree but that is the truth. Do you want to pretend that you don't know that she is always borrowing money? (Pauses and looks Ben directly in the eye as if in a challenge, but he doesn't respond.
- Ben: That is hypocrisy on your part. Eh...., also she tries to eh.... I mean to eh.... Forces herself to others. (Silence. Ben has gone to the window and is looking outside)
- Joy: (Continuing after a lengthy pause) Anyway.....
- Ben: (Clearly fed up) Enough! I am out of here.

Turn taking has not taken place at all

(4 marks)

- i. Joy does not give Ben a chance to say thank you after he is told to go in.
- ii. Before Ben finishes what he had to say in his first response, Joy jumps in.
- iii. Ben doesn' t finish his second response before Joy jumps in.
- iv. Joy should have responded when Joy looks him directly in the eye but he doesn't.
- v. Ben uses excess pauses which Joy should have filled in but she doesn't, Ben also diverts attention by looking out through the window.
- vi. Lengthy pauses in a conversation require the other interlocutor to jump in but Ben fails to notice this.

i) Identify and illustrate any two sound patterns in this poem.

(4 marks)

- 1. Rhyme bet/bait/gate or return / pain or afraid / returned/braised.
- 2. Alliteration the thief
- 3. Consonance had placed, had fled, stoned and bruised.

Any 2 well illustrated sound patterns.

1 mark identification and 1 mark illustration = 4 marks **NO ILLUSTRATIONS, NO MARK**

ii) What effect do they have on the poem?

(1 mark)

They contribute to the musicality of the poem / give the poem a tune or a regular beat of rhythm

iii) Identify any two words with /e/ sound and two words with /ei/ sound in the poem.

(4 marks)

/e/ - bet/fled/get/left/tell/great

/ei/ - afraid /bait/gate/pain

Any two pairs of words 1 mark for each pair = 2 marks

iv) Which word in the last line should be stressed?

Justice - because it is a content word.

e) Indicate the type of intonation appropriate for the following: (do not use arrows) (3 marks)

(i) Where is Jane? Falling
(ii) Do you like swimming? Rising
(iii) Oh my! Falling
