- iii) Selfish/ egocentric ✓1– He is only obsessed with being assisted to survive the onslaught in The Samaritan. ✓1
- iv) Irresponsible/ inept/ incompetent ✓1 – Admits that members of the Municipal Executive Council have failed him yet he is in charge. ✓1

e) Thematic concerns

- Hope/optimism ✓1– Nicole believes The Samaritan is a platform through which the people can demand the corrupt leaders’ removal from office and prosecuted. ✓
 - Pessimism ✓1– Mossi believes that The Samaritan, a computer programme, will not stop politicians from misappropriating/ plundering resources. ✓1
 - Education ✓1– “We teach the m to uphold the moral and civic virtues without which our society can never prosper, be fair, just, and peaceful.” ✓1
 - Morality/ uprightness ✓1– Nicole be they are responsible for electing the wrong people in office. Believes the school disseminates such virtues like honesty, truthfulness, generosity, integrity and transparency. ✓1
 - Ineptitude/ incompetence/ irresponsibility ✓1– as the mayor, Mossi admits that the leaders under him have failed him big time. ✓
