

For <i>plural nouns</i> that end in <i>-s</i> , only the apostrophe is added to show ownership.	The girl <b>s'</b> gym is over there. The boy <b>s'</b> hockey team plays tomorrow.
When showing ownership for more than one noun, only the last noun takes the <b>'s</b> or the apostrophe.	Sam, Dawn, and Kim <b>'s</b> teacher was absent from school yesterday. The lions and tiger <b>s'</b> cages are always cleaned or Mondays.
For proper nouns (names) that end in <i>-s</i> , <b>'s</b> is added to show ownership.	Jame <b>s's</b> bike is blue. Juliu <b>s's</b> house is near the river.
