- 1. Give five teachings of peter concerning the people of God (1peter 2:9-10)(5mks)
 - The believers are chosen people/race/they have been selected.
 - They are a royal priesthood.

 - They are to declare wonderful deeds of god.
 - They were called from darkness to light.

 - He started speaking in tongues.

 - He took up leadership roles.
 - He called people to repentance.
 - He was empowered to perform miracles.

 - A relationship which favors/discriminate against race/tribe/education/gender/religion.
 - A relationship which starts when one is trouble
 - A relationship which is based on lies/cheating.
 - A relationship which is over protective/over possessive.
- 4. Describe the unity of believers as expressed in the concept of the church (8mks)
 - Paul used the symbol of marriage to show the unity of belivers.
 - Christians are united the Christ just as a husband is united to his wife.

- Christ loves the church just as the husband loves the wife.
- The church has to submit to her wife submits to her husband.
- Christ is the head of the church just as the husband is the head of the wife.
- Just as husband loves his own body so Christ loves the church.
- 5. Explain similarities between the traditional African and old testament prophets(6mks)
 - Both predicted future events which cane to pass
 - Both acted as mediator between god and the people.
 - Both had supernatural powers to exercise their duties/charismatic/spoke with authority.
 - Both had a personal relationship with god/received revelation through vision/dreams/chosen.
 - They were religion leaders who could offer sacrifices/prayer.
 - Both played as advisory role to the political leaders /acted as the conscience of the leaders
 - Both urged their people to normally upright/condemned evil in society.
 - Both led exemplary lives/were role models.
 - In both were prophetesses and prophets.
- 6. Explain three categories of true prophets in the old testament(6mks)
 - Major prophets-the messages are elaborate/detailed
 - Minor prophets-they have short/brief messages.
 - Canonical prophets-they are prophets whose utterances are recorded in books that bear their names.
 - Non-canonical/prophets-they are prophets whose oracles/messages have been compiled by other authors.
 - Cultic-they are prophets whose duties were associated with the places of worship.
 - Early prophets- were sent by God for specific tasks.
- 7. Give five reasons why Jesus used bread and wine during the last supper(5mks)
 - Jesus used bread because it was a common meal for the jews.
 - He used bread because unleavened bread was used during the jewish celebration of Passover.
 - He used wine because it was a common drink for the jews.
 - Jesus explain that, the bread represented his body which would be broken for forgiveness of sin..
 - He used wine to represent his blood that was to be shed for the sealing of the new covenant.
 - He used the bread to demonstrate that he is the bread of life.
 - Jesus shared bread and wine as a sign of fellowship/unity/preparation for messianic banquet.



- Jesus used bread and wine to institutionalize/demonstrate how the disciples would practice their ritual in future.
