- 1 a) outline Isaiah's prophecy about the messiah on the suffering servant in Isaiah 53. (8mks).
 - i) the servant will succeed in his work and will highly be honoured
 - ii) the servant is despised, rejected and ignored by those who are with him
 - iii) He has nothing attractive .He is very ordinary and simple
 - iv) He is harshly treated, arrested, sentenced to death and killed
 - v) His body is buried with those of the rich men
 - vi) He accepts the suffering on behalf of others
 - vii) Through his suffering, human beings are reconciled to God
 - viii) It was the will of God that the servant should suffer
 - ix) His suffering is a sacrifice to bring forgiveness of sins

 - i. Mary had found favour with God
 - ii) She will give birth to a son to be named Jesus
 - iii) The son would be holy
 - iv) The son will be great and called son of the most high
 - v) The lord will give him the throne of his father David
 - vi) The kingdom would never end
 - vii) He would reign over the house of Jacob forever
 - viii) The Holy Spirit would come upon Mary
 - ix) Her cousin Elizabeth had also conceived in old age

 - v) Family ties should not be broken/should live in unity
 - vi) God's work takes priority over the family
 - vii) Parents should recognize their children's talents/abilities
 - viii) There should be open communication among family members
- 2 a) with reference to Luke 5:17-26, describe the healing of the paralytic man (8mks).
 - i) Men brought a man who was paralyzed to be healed by Jesus



- ii) They sought to bring him and lay him before Jesus but the place was crowded
- iii) They went up on the roof and let him down through the tiles into the midst before Jesus
- iv) Jesus saw their faith
- v) He told the man 'your sins are forgiven'
- vi) The scribes and the Pharisees began to question in their hears' who is this that speaks blasphemy'
- vii) Jesus perceived their questioning and asked 'which is easier to say 'your sins are forgiven' or say 'rise up and walk'
- viii) But that you may know the son of man has authority to forgive sins, he said to the man,' rise, take up your bed and go home"
- ix) Immediately the man arose and before them walked home glorifying God
- x) All were seized with amazement and they glorified God
- xi) They were filled with awe saying 'we have seen strange things today'

- v. They should be used in an orderly manner
- vi. They should be used in love
- vii. Use of tongues should be minimized in public worship
- viii. There is need to have interpretation of tongues for them to be useful
- ix. Prophecies should be carefully evaluated/weighed

- 5.a) Explain the traditional African understanding of marriage. (7mks)
 - i. Marriage is a complete affair which involves the economic, social and religious aspects of the people.
 - ii. It is viewed as the focus of existence, the point where all members of the community meet, i.e. the dead, the living and the unborn.
- iii. It is a rhythm of life through which everyone must participate.
- iv. It is a duty and requirement for everyone in the community to undergo/ compulsory.
- v. Those people who do not marry are considered a curse to the community/outcasts.
- vi. Marriage as an institution is believed to have been willed and ordained by God.
- vii. Young people are prepared for this sacred duty during initiation through teachings.



- viii. Marriage is not complete without children/ it is meant for procreation.
- ix. Marriage is meant to be permanent as divorce is discouraged, unless for very serious reasons.
- x. Bride wealth is a must/ very necessary as it cements the marriage relationship/ covenant.
- xi. The wife is subordinate to the husband but has her established rights.
- xii. Marriage does not end with the death of a husband as the wife is inherited.

- c) Give seven criteria that Christians use to evaluate the use of leisure. (7mks)
 - i. Christians evaluate leisure using Biblical principles.
 - ii. Leisure originated in the Old Testament in the creation story where God created the world in six days and rested on the seventh day (Sabbath)
 - iii. Christians observe the Sabbath in obedience to God. They set aside daily chores and spend time worshipping God.
 - iv. Christians should create leisure time daily to pray and thank God for His goodness, love and mercy, and seek forgiveness so as to better their relationship with God.
 - v. Christian teachings recommend the limitation of leisure to morally upright activities that please God, which enhance God-given talents such as swimming, singing, drama, etc, which relax the mind and are fulfilling. (1Cor. 10:31; Phil. 4:8)
 - vi. Christians should condemn the use of alcohol and other drugs which lead to addiction and other dangers.
 - vii. Christians should also choose leisure activities that enrich their knowledge of God such as gospel music, reading religious literature, holding religious discussions, which also help them to avoid sin.
 - viii. Leisure time for a Christian should provide an opportunity to make discoveries and improve oneself, e.g. reading good books and watching good movies.
 - ix. Christians should also choose activities that provide service to others, just like Jesus, e.g. visiting the sick, preaching the gospel, doing charity work.



- x. Christians should avoid activities that are condemned in the Bible, e.g. gambling, sexual immorality, stealing etc, which are sinful.
- xi. Christians should avoid leisure activities that may be harmful to others even if they are beneficial to them e.g. playing loud music.
- xii. Christians should not engage in leisure activities that are risky to one's life e.g. boxing, wrestling, sky diving, bull fighting etc.

- i. Desire for unmerited promotion.

- vii. Greed.
- viii. Lack of adequate job opportunities.

- xiii. Permissiveness/culture of society

c) How can Christians today help to improve the environment? (6mks)

- i. Christians, as stewards, should take care of the environment as it is the source of livelihood/be good role models.
- ii. Christians should be at the fore front to condemn and fight all forms of environmental destruction.



- iii. Christians should advocate for penalties on those who destroy the environment.
- iv. Christians should help educate people on the importance of the environment and the need to preserve it.
- v. Be in the forefront to adopt the four R's policy in waste management. That is Reduce, Re-use, Recycle, and Recover.
- vi. Support the government to enforce the use of environment-friendly fuel such as unleaded fuel which produces less carbon monoxide.
- vii. Christians should participate in environmental cleanups and support the provision of disposal bins in public places.
- viii. Advocate for environmental conservation laws to be passed, e.g. on the need to reduce noise from vehicles, aircrafts and entertainment centers.
- ix. Reporting cases of environmental degradation to relevant authorities.
