- The existence of false prophets who gave false promises to the Israelites.
- King Ahab had allowed his Phoenician wife to bring the worship of false gods and goddesses.
- Jezebel ordered the persecution of the true prophets of God.
- King Ahab had allowed the building of temples/ high places for the worship of Baal.
- The Canaanite religion had a strong influence on the Israelites.
- The king participated in idol worship.
- The idol gods could be seen/ touched so they appeared real

- There was competition in speaking in tongues
- There was no interpretation of tongues hence messages were not understood
- People did not show love to one another as they used the gifts of the Holy spirit
- There was disorder/ confusion in worship as people with different gifts tried to outdo one another
- People did not use their gifts for the growth/development of the church
- Gifts such as prophecy/ teaching/ preaching were looked down upon

c) Ways in which Christians prevent divisions in the Church in Kenya today (7mks)

- Treat each other with love
- Avoid discrimination/segregation/tribalism in the church
- Preach/teach the word of God/bible truths to believers
- Assist those in problems/poor/the less fortunate/the needy
- Practice humility/avoid arrogance
- Openly discuss issues affecting the church/respect the opinions of thither people
- Pray for one another/problems affecting the church
- Practice transparent leadership style
- Give transparent leadership style
- Follow the church doctrines/ constitutions/manuals/education members on church procedures
- Repent/ask for forgiveness whenever they are wrong/accept their mistakes
- Preparing a budget annually/seasonally ensuring that the resources are well utilized

4a) characteristics of false prophets in the Old Testament (6mks)

• False prophets did not have a divine call/raised themselves.



- They spoke falsehoods/lies.
- They prophesied out of their own minds/imaginations.
- They prophesied what the people wanted to hear/according to circumstances
- They misled people from the covenant way of life/promoted idolatry.
- They hindered the work of true prophets.
- They worked for material gain/paid for their services.
- Their prophecies were not fulfilled.

b) why Israel would face God's judgement according to teachings of prophet Amos (8mks)

- Cheating in business among the traders of Israel; they tampered with the standard weighing scale.
- Greed and excessive luxury- selfish women of Samaria oppressed the poor and were drinking too much wine
- Bribery and corruption in the law courts in Israel that were done by the elders
- They practiced idolatry and hypocrisy
- They practiced sexual immorality
- Robbery and violence where the rich acquired a lot of wealth through unfair means such as exploiting the poor
- Self-indulgence and false sense of security by the powerful leaders of Israel who thought
 God could not punish them
- High interest charges were being levied on loan borrowed by the poor.

c) How the Church in Kenya punish errant members

- They are denied the Holy Communion/ other sacraments for some time.
- They are suspended from the church.
- They are denied leadership positions in the church.



- They are denied some services of the church
- They are reprimanded by leaders of the church and told to repent their sins.
- They are forced to repent in public about their wrong doings.
- They are given stern warnings.
- They are charged a fine.
- Some churches assign the certain chores to perform as punishment.
- Some churches withdraw certain privileges from the culprits e.g. pastors are defrocked.
- Church leaders are transferred from one station to another.

5a) personal life of Jeremiah

- Jeremiah was the son of Hilkiah, a priest. He was born in the town of Anathoth, north of Jerusalem, in the southern Kingdom(Judah)
- He was still a youth when he was called by God to prophesy and he thought he was too young
- His prophetic mission forced him to sacrifice personal happiness. He was commanded by God not to marry or have children and he was not to attend social gathering
- He was rejected by his family and some relatives even plotted to kill him
- He was persecuted by the kings and treated with hostility by priest and false prophets
 when he challenged them over their false prophecies
- Jeremiah was imprisoned for prophesying the fall of Jerusalem and the destruction of the temple
- He was realised from prison by the Babylonian army but he chose to remain in Judah when the other Israelites were taken into exile
- However he continued to communicate with the exile by writing them message of hope
- As faithful messenger of God Jeremiah continued with his prophesy from Egypt where he
 is believed to have died

b) evils condemned by Prophet Jeremiah during the Temple sermon.(8mks)



- He condemned human sacrifice
- False belief about the temple not being destroyed
- Hypocrisy in worship/pretence of people who committed different sins but came to the temple
- Defilements of the temple, hence blasphemy by failing to honour God in the temple/ placing idols in it
- Syncretism the Israelites worshipped idols
- Repeated stubbornness and rebellion by the Israelites and their refusal to repent despite prophetic warning (8x1)
