Read the following extract and answer the questions that follow.

Mrs. Linde: but how can this well-bred man be so tactless?

Nora: I don't understand you at all.

Mrs. Linde: Don't <u>prevaricate</u>, Nora. Do you suppose I don't guess who lent you the two? Hundred and fifty pounds?

Nora: are you out of your senses? How can you think of such a thing! A friend of ours who comes here every day! Do you realize what a horribly painful position that would be? Besides, he had no money to lend then, he came into his money afterwards

Mrs. Linde: No, certainly not. It would never have entered into my head for a moment.

Mrs. Linde: well, I think that was lucky for you, my dear Nora.

Nora: No, it would never have come into my head to ask Doctor Rank. Although I am quite sure that if I had asked him...

Mrs. Linde: But of course, you won't.

Nora: Of course not. I have no reason to think it could possibly be necessary. But I am quite sure that if I told Doctor Rank-

Mrs. Linde: behind your husband's back.

Nora: <u>I must make an end of</u> it with the other one, and that will be behind his back too. I must make an end of it with him.

Mrs. Linde: yes, that is what I told you yesterday, but-

Nora: (walking up and down) a man can put a thing like that straight much easier than a woman-

Mrs. Linde: One's husband, yes.

Nora: nonsense! (*Standing still*) when you pay off a debt you get your bond back, don't you?

Mrs. Linde: Yes, as a matter of course.

Nora: and can tear it into a hundred thousand pieces, and burn it up- the nasty dirty paper!

Mrs. Linde: (looks hard at her, lays down her sewing and gets up slowly) Nora, you are concealing something from me.

Nora: Do I look as if I were?

Mrs. Linde: Something has happened to you since yesterday morning. Nora, what's it?

- Nora tells Mrs. Linde that she also has something to be happy and proud of
- She tells Mrs. Linde how she saved her husband Helmer's life by taking him to Italy for recuperation when he was dreadfully ill.
- She informs her that she had to spend 250 pounds for the trip, and she secured the money by herself without her husband's knowledge. Mrs. Linde wonders how she could have done that since women cannot borrow without the husband's consent.
- Nora says that she might have gotten the money from some doctor-some rich man, who is a secret admirer of hers. Mrs. Linde suspects that it might have been Dr. Rank who comes to Nora's every day.
