- The least in the kingdom of God is greater than John (5mks)
- b) Describe the incident when Jesus was rejected at Nazareth (Lk 4:16 30)
 - Jesus came to Nazareth where he was brought up.
 - He went to the synagogue as he usually did on the Sabbath day.
 - He was given a book of prophet Isaiah when he stood up to read.
 - He opened the book, found the place that was written about Him and read it to the people.
 - After reading he closed the book and gave it to the attendant and sat down.
 - Everybody in the synagogue looked at Him.
 - He told them that the scripture he has read was fulfilled in their hearing.
 - All people were happy with what he had spoken.
 - People wondered a loud saying" is this not Joseph's son.
 - Jesus told them that they would ask Him to do in his own country things he had done in Carpernaum/ he told them that a prophet is of accepted in his own country things.
 - He told them that there were many widows in Israel during the time of Elijah but God sent the prophet to a widow in Zarephath/God only healed Naaman the Syrian of leprosy during the time of prophet Elisha.
 - They were filled with anger/wanted to thrown him lead long the cliff - Jesus passed through their midst and went away (8X₁)
